


Calling someone "Father"

Last Easter season a new convert to Catholicism at my parish asked me with a grave tone in her voice: "Why do we call priests 'father' if Jesus says, 'Call no man on earth your father, for you have one Father, who is in heaven'?" Thinking myself clever, I asked, "Do you think it's okay to call someone your 'teacher' or 'mister' or 'dad'?" She said, "Yes, I do." I responded, "Well, Jesus seems to forbid that, too. So, it's obviously hyperbole that he's using." She thought for a moment and declared, "Then I will stop using those words, too!" She walked away...not the outcome I was seeking.

We shouldn't be too hasty in dismissing this complaint voiced by many non-Catholics. The expression "father" for ordained priests is not honorary for the individual man. The priest's fatherhood doesn't begin or end in him at all. Rather, the title "Father" indicates that he is a sacramental sign of God's Fatherhood revealed in Jesus. I can tell you, as a very unworthy bearer of that title, we should give and receive that title with some trepidation (because of God's awesomeness) and with a little sense of humor (because of the lowliness of the men with the title).

The longer I'm a priest, the more I'm comfortable with people not using the title "father" and just calling me "John." After all, only God is Father in the truest sense. At the same time, Jesus has brought the Father close to us, very close. We honor this closeness in some men with the title "Father." Who are the priests in your life whom Christ has sent to you? How wonderful that Christ has surrounded us with humble signs of His Father's love. It's good to celebrate that love with gratitude for the priests in our lives. "Fr. John Muir, ©LPi

This weekend, you can become a Liturgical Minister!

It's always a blessing to worship together at our weekend Masses, but did you know it takes a lot of parishioners to make a beautiful liturgy possible?

This weekend, why not consider sharing your gifts by becoming a liturgical minister? We're always looking for ushers, greeters, altar

servers, choir members, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, PowerPoint, and liturgical environment ministers. You can even sign up to help with our Simbang Gabi novena Masses during Advent.

Whatever the ministry, you'll find the experience rewarding, and it's a great way to get better acquainted with our faith community! After any of our weekend Masses, grab a donut and check in with our Ministry leaders at the tables in the main plaza.

Altar Care

Launders the Mass linens and white robes. Ministers share this service on a rotating basis— perfect for those who like behind-the-scenes work and done at home at their convenience.

Altar Servers – Weekend Mass

Boys and girls, who are at least 9 years old or in the 4th grade, their parents and other adults over the age of 18 who want to serve our parish through a more active role in liturgy, are welcome. Training is required and can be arranged individually or in small groups.

Daily Mass Ministry

Daily Mass community assists the priest at weekday Mass as Eucharistic Ministers (Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion), Altar Servers and Lectors. Training provided.

Extraordinary Minister of Communion (Eucharistic Minister) – Weekend Mass

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion distribute Holy Communion at the weekend Masses. You must be registered in the parish, must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation and must attend a training.

Greeters-Weekend Mass

Greeters welcome people coming to Mass on Saturdays and Sundays, Holy Days and special liturgies. Greeters arrive 15-20 minutes early and are scheduled a specific Mass that suits their schedule.

Lectors (Ministers of the Word)-Weekend Mass

Lectors should be comfortable with public speaking. In addition to the scripture readings, lectors lead the congregation in the Prayers of the Faithful. You must be a registered member of the parish; if a teenager, you must be confirmed, and you must attend a lector training session. Lectors are also assigned to Holy Day Masses and other special liturgies throughout the year.

Liturgical Environment

Creates and enhances the beauty of our church to make our worship space more prayerful and esthetically pleasing. While their work is most noticeable during the major seasons of the Church Year, the ministry functions year-round.

Music Ministry (Parish Choir)-Weekend Mass

Men and women of all ages are welcome to join the parish choir. Rehearsals are held Wednesday evenings in the church. Generally, rehearsals run from September through Corpus Christi. Choral experience is appreciated, though not required. We also welcome families of all sizes (especially those with teenagers and young children).

Other represented Liturgical Ministries: PowerPoint (run the computer to display the lyrics and prayers during Mass), **Ushers** (facilitate seating and the collection offering), and **Simbang Gabi** (seeking liturgical ministries to serve at the Simbang Gabi Christmas Novena, December 16-24).



Family Connection



"Do as I say, not as I do." How many of us have been tempted to say this to our children? In today's Gospel we hear a resounding reply from Jesus, "Practice what you preach." Those who know us best, our family and especially our children, can identify the inconsistencies between what we want to teach and the example that we give. The challenge for all of us, especially for those of us who are parents, is to model with

consistency the faith and the Christian way of life we wish to teach our children.

As you gather as a family, talk about what it means to practice what you preach. Identify some examples of people you know who practice what they preach. What do you observe about these people? What do you admire about them?

In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus talk about the importance of acting in ways that are consistent with our faith. Read together today's Gospel, Matthew 23:1-12.
